

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT KEEPING JUNK CARS ON YOUR PROPERTY

This is how the Pennsville Township ordinance defines Junk motor Vehicles:

“Unused and inoperative junk motor vehicle is intended to mean any motor vehicle which is no longer in actual use as a motor vehicle, or which is wholly unfit without repairing or reconditioning for use upon the public roadways, or which has been discarded for use as a motor vehicle. The fact that such motor vehicle is unregistered and not currently inspected shall be evidential of its nature as herein prohibited.” Chapter 14, Article 3, Section 14.3-2.

So, if you have a thing that matches that definition on your property you are in violation of the Ordinance.

The following is what the Pennsville Township Ordinance has to say about keeping junk motor vehicles on your property:

“No person, firm, association or corporation shall place, keep or store or permit or suffer the placing, keeping or storing of any unused or inoperative junk motor vehicle or parts thereof upon any private property in the Township of Pennsville.” Chapter 14, Article 3, Section 14.3-3.

If you want to avoid the hassle of receiving a violation notice, or court summons and, penalties get rid of the junk motor vehicle. Sell it or donate it to charity.
