

The Township Planning and Zoning Boards ensure compliance with the Stormwater Control Ordinance before issuing final subdivision or site plan approval. All major developments are reviewed by the Board Engineer as part of the approval process.

<p>The Township currently reviews all new development and redevelopment projects to ensure compliance with the New Jersey Residential Site Improvement Standards and the Stormwater Control Ordinance for stormwater where these standards apply. All projects where the Board has jurisdiction are reviewed by the Board Engineer. The stormwater review is supported by the review escrow that is posted at the time of application. Typically, there are multiple review iterations prior to final design acceptance.</p>

The Township of Pennsville Vehicle Maintenance activities are performed indoors. In the event that vehicle/equipment maintenance is necessary outside - vehicle/equipment are covered with tarps as to prevent stormwater related run-off or run-on.

The Township of Pennsville Equipment and Vehicle washing activities are conducted indoors at the Public Works Department.

4. Discharge of Stormwater from Secondary Containment

Discharge of stormwater from Secondary Containment is not applicable to the Township of Pennsville.

5. Salt and De-Icing Material Storage and Handling
Salt and De-Icing Material storage and Handling activities are conducted indoors for the Township of Pennsville.
6. Aggregate Material and Construction Debris Storage
Aggregate material and construction debris are stored in a 3-sided storage bay. The storage bay is covered with a tarp and with the open side protected by an upslope and use of straw bales as to prevent stormwater run-on and run-off.
7. Street Sweepings, Catch Basin Clean Out and Other Material Storage
Street sweepings are housed in steel containers (bins / dumpsters) and hauled to Salem County Improvement Authority Sanitary Landfill on a weekly basis.
8. Yard Trimmings and Wood Waste Management Sites
Yard Trimmings and Wood Waste are managed in a method as to prevent stormwater run-on and run-off. Additionally, Yard Trimmings and Wood Waste are removed to permitted off-site facility every two weeks.
9. Roadside Vegetation Management
Roadside Vegetation Management for the Township of Pennsville consists of manual methods of controlling vegetation – pesticides are not used for roadside vegetation control.

1. Mercury
